OPINION

KENNETH EVANS

THIS MATTER came on for hearing before the North Carolina Innocence Inquiry

Commission (Commission) on September 9, 2019 through September 10, 2019, pursuant to

N.C.G.S. §§ 15A-1460 – 1475. After careful review of the evidence presented, the Commission hereby makes and enters the following findings of fact:

- On March 5, 1990, Euther "Rea" Andrews Manning was robbed and kidnapped from her home.
- 2. On April 7, 1995, Kenneth Evans was found guilty, after a jury trial, of First Degree Kidnapping, Second Degree Burglary, Robbery with a Dangerous Weapon, and Larceny. He received a sentence of forty years for First Degree Kidnapping; a sentence of forty years for Robbery with a Dangerous Weapon; and a sentence of ten years for Breaking and Entering to run consecutive to a sentence of forty years he received in 92 CRS 4717 (Franklin County).
- Evans appealed his conviction for Second Degree Burglary. The Court of Appeals vacated
 that conviction and remanded it for entry of judgment as a conviction of Felonious Breaking
 or Entering.
- 4. On August 10, 2016, Evans applied to the Commission claiming innocence in this case and the Commission began an inquiry pursuant to Article 92, Chapter 15A, of the General Statutes.

- 5. Throughout the Commission's inquiry, Evans has fully cooperated with Commission staff in accordance with N.C.G.S. § 15A-1467(g).
- 6. On September 9, 2019 through September 10, 2019, the Commission held a full evidentiary hearing in this matter pursuant to N.C.G.S. § 15A-1468.
- 7. During the hearing, the Commission considered testimonial and documentary evidence. The evidence included, among other things:
 - a. A 454-page brief provided to the Commission by the Commission's Director prior to the hearing;
 - b. Supplemental documentation, in the form of handouts, a PowerPoint presentation, and video recordings provided prior to and during the hearing;
 - c. Live testimony by Commission Grant Staff Attorney Catherine Matoian,
 Commission Grant Legal Investigator Mackenzie Myers, DNA expert Meghan
 Clement, trace expert Kristen Crawford, Ron Keane, Amanda Nosalek, Larry Davis,
 and Kenneth Evans; and
 - d. An affidavit from Shirley Evans.
- 8. After carefully considering this evidence, the Commission has concluded by a vote of 6-2 that there is sufficient evidence of factual innocence to merit judicial review.

WHEREFORE, pursuant to N.C.G.S. § 15A-1468(c), and as Chair of the Commission, the undersigned refers this case to the Honorable John M. Dunlow, Senior Resident Superior Court Judge for Judicial District 9, and respectfully requests that the Chief Justice of the North Carolina Supreme Court appoint a three-judge panel and issue commissions to its members to convene a special session of Superior Court of Franklin County to hear evidence relevant to the Commission's recommendation.
